| 4. Guest Kate Kerr Superintendent <br> Kate is the incoming Superintendent this year, she is a mother of two boys, one Chatelech Secondary and one at Roberts Creek Elementary, her husband is also a teacher in the district. Kate believes education is the most important element in driving social change for the better, and in creating the best possible opportunities for children so that they can be the best humans that they can be. <br> The PAC had the opportunity to also ask some questions- <br> - Patrick Bocking had a multiyear strategy and are you going to continue that? This is the Boards District strategic plan. The Ministry has also implemented the Framework for enhancing student learning. Because of Patrick and the Boards leadership and foresight we can fit into the requirements that the ministry has given. We are currently midcycle of the District Strategic plan, finishing in 2023. The Board has already started conversation on what next steps will be, as well there will be a lengthy and robust consultation period before the next Strategic Plan, so yes that plan is on a four-year cycle and will continue. <br> - What are your priorities and focuses? The priorities are built together with Trustees and Leadership, inclusion continues as a really important focus as well as equity. The board has also developed an Anti-Racism policy, an AntiPoverty policy, and those will be transforming into operationalizing them as regulations. Truth And Reconciliation continues to be a focus, working with our partners the Sechelt and Squamish Nations. <br> - What do you mean by Anti-Poverty policy, how does the district implement this? An ad-hoc-committee was formed, and then there was extensive consultation with a poverty reduction association that has done work on the coast. The committee reached out to Nicholas Simons, MCFD, our Indigenous Advisory Circles and many others for their perspective, and what it is about bringing awareness to equity. Education can only go so far, the policy does not solve poverty, but it recognizes poverty, and it means that we are making decisions based on equitable outcomes for all children and ensuring that children have equitable access to all of our programs. For example, school supplies, it is very unusual for a district to provide school supplies for every student, but that decision to place resources for that reason was around equity. The other thing about the policy that is very important is removing stigma. It does not solve everything, but it does certainly bring awareness. |  |  |  |
